## The Brain Injury Information Card for young people aged 11-17

The Child Brain Injury Trust are delighted to offer your son or daughter a personal Brain Injury Information Card. They could use this card in situations where they feel it may be beneficial for those around them to be aware of their brain injury.

It is not a sign of weakness to show the card when you need to, in fact it takes courage to stand up for yourself sometimes.

Situations where your son or daughter could use this card:

- Starting a new social or sporting group you may want the group leader to be aware
  of your difficulties.
- . If you are in a shop and need some kind of help.
- . On public transport you may need help with getting a ticket or finding a seat.
- At school, when you have a teacher who does not know your medical history or perhaps a supply teacher who has never met you before.
- If you should ever be spoken to by a Police Officer, you can show them your card so they know you may need extra help and support.
- Any situation where other people may not understand your behaviour or require clarification of your difficulties.

The card holder is the person whose image and details are shown on the front of the card.

The Child Brain Injury Trust have issued the card solely for the use of providing information to those who may need it, relating to the card holder's brain injury and as such may not be used for any other purpose.

This card is valid up to and including the card holder's 18th Birthday.
