Rehabilitation centres for children with acquired brain injury

There are a limited number of specialist rehabilitation centres for children and young people following childhood acquired brain injury compared to those available for adults. The clinical team at the hospital will advise if they feel further rehabilitation would be beneficial for your son or daughter.

Most of the centres below will require a referral from the Local Authority or a Case Manager, and they will then assess your child's needs; you will then be advised if they are able to assist and have places available.

We suggest you contact the centres directly and make your own enquiries initially.
